

The Amazing Adventures of Gavin, a leafy Seadragon - From White Pointers to



KNOWING, GROWING AND EATING EDIBLE WILD NATIVE PLANTS

Neville Bonney will be giving a presentation at the Normanville Surf Life Saving Club on May 7th at 7.00 on edible wild native plants. Neville has been at the forefront of promoting Australian Native Flora for fifty years. His passion has covered aspects such as propagation, landscaping, seed collection and germination, farm forestry, bush botany, tree planting, broad acre direct seeding, revegetation, creating natural habitats, ethno botany and as an educator. He has written many books which will be available on the night. Bookings are essential as we will also be enjoying some samples during the evening.

Edible wild food plants is the term used when talking

about any edible food that has originated from plant material. These can be items such as fruit, fungi, nuts, leaves, seeds, tubers, fleshy rhizomes and even seaweeds. These may come from the bush, seashores or grown domestically in orchards or within revegetation projects.

LOCAL WALKS



Our last monthly walk was a historic wander around Normanville. Margaret Morgan from the Yankalilla and District Historical Society lead 20 of us through the back streets of Normanville where we were amazed at the history of some of the places we consider common place, having no idea of their importance in the development of this area. It was so interesting we hope to have a historical walk of Yankalilla towards the end of the year.

Our next walk is on Thursday 26th March and we will be heading up to Big Gorge, Yankalilla Bay at 4.30 pm. This walk also has lots of history as Light surveyed the area in 1836, his recording in his diary stated "Out surveying, and walked up the valley; running in south-easterly direction, between very high hills. I was enchanted with this spot, it put me in mind of some of the orchards in Devonshire, and I found it plentifully supplied with fresh water. From this valley we ascended the hills, crossed over the sea-coast, and returned to our tents: the whole distance fine soil." This was the Big Gorge. After settlement the historic coach road, which linked Adelaide with Yankalilla and Cape Jervis turned up the Big Gorge so we should be able to walk past the ruins of the old Two-Storey Hotel. FREE LITTLE LIBRARIES
